Matteo Manassero and Ryan Fox both fired rounds of 6-under, 64 to move to 14-under and take a one-shot lead into the final round of the 2025 RBC Canadian Open at TPC Toronto at Osprey Valley. Lee Hodges, Kevin Yu and Matt McCarty all sit in a tie for third at 13-under. Mackenzie Hughes leads the Canadian contingent at 12-under after shooting a 64 on Saturday. Twenty-two players sit within four shots or less of the leaders, setting up an electric finish on Sunday at TPC Toronto.
